Dear Mr Chisholm, I have forwarded two e-mails I sent to HM The Queen to Jack McConnell. The e-mails are regarding a Supplemental Charter from the Privy Counsel Office that has had Royal assent and awaits the Scottish Seal. As a member of the public I am objecting to this Supplemental Charter which was applied for by the Dunfermline Carnegie Trust without giving any indication to the people of Dunfermline (who are most affected by it) of the terms of amendment to the Royal Charter. I consider that the terms of my objection to the ratification of the Supplemental Charter by the Scottish Executive are self evident from my e-mail to Her Majesty but I would ask you to confirm that you have received these e-mails which are together with this e-mail to be taken considered as a request to the Scottish Executive to refuse to apply the Scottish Seal to the Carnegie Dunfermline Trust's Supplemental Charter.

For the avoidance of doubt my objection is that the Supplemental Charter has, as a matter of law, not been properly applied for by the Carnegie Dunfermline Trust in that they did not advertise the proposed terms of amendment to the general public and in particular to the people of Dunfermline who are the named beneficiaries of the Royal Charter. The failure by the Carnegie Dunfermline Trust to consult interested parties on proposed changes to the rules governing the activities of the Trustees is contrary to the common good and Scots Law .

I can of course send a full submission of documents required by you to determine my claim.
