

Convictions recorded for the Dunfermline dozen **before** and **after** their conviction in 1850

James Johnstone, coal drawer, son of Helen Boyle or Johnstone, widow, Rumblingwell, Dunfermline; with ALEXANDER McPHERSON, miner, residing with James Nisbet, miner, Rumblingwell, tried at **DSC 28 Aug 1848** for assaulting each other and breach of the peace; **14 days** or 10s (SC21/23/9)

Thomas Hunter, and JOSEPH HUNTER, **JAMES JOHNSTONE**, JOHN HODGE, and DAVID WILSON, all miners, Townhill Colliery, Dunfermline; tried at DSC 21 **Sep 1853** for breach of the peace; **30 days** or 15s (SC21/23/12)

John Hill, labourer, son of Alexander Hill, labourer, Golfdrum, Dunfermline; with WILLIAM BARREY, weaver, lodging with Helen Smith, Kirkgate, Dunfermline; and **ADAM BAXTER**, weaver, son of George Baxter, Golfdrum; and ALEXANDER YOUNG jnr, weaver, son of Alexander Young snr, weaver, Pittencrieff Street, Dunfermline; and DAVID DUNCAN, weaver, son of Andrew Duncan, Pittencrieff Street; and ROBERT DONALDSON, weaver, lodging with George Bonnar in Pittencrieff; and ROBERT KEIR jnr, weaver, son of Robert Keir snr, weaver, James Place, Dunfermline; tried at **DSC 5 June 1848** for assault on Thomas Haxton and John Forbes, farm servants to Robert Beveridge, tenant of Urquhart and Logie; Hill and **Baxter, 60 days**; others, 40 days (SC21/23/9)

Adam Baxter, journeyman weaver, aged 19 on 1850, son of George Baxter, weaver, Golfdrum Street, Dunfermline; convictions in various courts [1] with Duncan McNaughton (aged 25), journeyman weaver, Golfdrum Street, and **George Philp** (16), journeyman flesher, son of John Philp, flesher, Pittencrieff Street, Dunfermline, tried at PCC 25 Sep 1850 for mobbing and rioting; 18 months impr (AD14/50/198; JC26/1850/150 & 151); in Perth Prison in 1851 (Census), weaver, aged 18, born Dunfermline [2] **DSC 21 Jan 1853**; malicious mischief and breach of the peace; **20 days** or 15s (SC21/23/12)
